

Dear Dearborn Scholarship Applicant,

We are happy to have your interest in our program. I would like to emphasize that we are looking for very special people; the future inventors, innovators and leaders of our country, students with a scientific mind, strong background in the basic principles of physics and who excel in problem solving and logical reasoning. This includes those majoring in physics, chemistry, chemical engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical engineering and nuclear engineering. Below is an explanation of the phases of our program:

PHASE I: Completion of the on-line application for a Dearborn Foundation Scholarship. **Applications must include the most recent official copy of the student's transcript as well as a letter from the professor recommending the applicant.**

PHASE II: The school recommending the applicant will administer a mechanical aptitude test, the results of the test will be forwarded by the school to the Dearborn Foundation. Contact the chairman of the department that is recommending you for the date and time to take the test. The Foundation will then review the entire application package including the results of the mechanical test and if the applicant meets the criteria he/she will be notified to take an interest and aptitude assessment on the internet.

PHASE III: If the applicant and the "test" results meet our expectations the information will be reviewed by the Selection Committee.

Phase IV: After the Selection Committee has completed a review of the application and testing results, their recommendations will be forwarded to the Board of Directors for the final decision on the granting of the scholarship.

Applications must be received by February 15th to be considered for the following academic year. Applicants will be notified by the first week of May of the decision by the Board of Directors.
